A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF AN APPLICATION FOR FUNDS FROM THE MARYLAND SMALL CITIES COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE LISTED PROJECTS.

RECITALS

The Maryland Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program helps preserve and develop viable rural and urban communities by providing decent housing, supporting infrastructure and assisting communities in meeting critical needs through Community Development Block Grants; and

The State of Maryland, through the Department of Housing and Community Development, has solicited applications from eligible jurisdictions to apply for funding under the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program; and

Wicomico County, Maryland must apply on behalf of a non-profit organization, and provide evidence of a commitment to the project with a local contribution, to obtain funds from the Small Cities CDBG program through the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development; and

After duly advertised public hearing, the County Council of Wicomico County has determined that the following projects would serve the interest of all citizens and especially those citizens of low and moderate income.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Council of Wicomico County, Maryland as follows:

1. The County Council of Wicomico County, Maryland hereby supports an application for funds from the Maryland Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Program for the following projects:
 - A. Proposal of the Community Development Division of the Salisbury-Wicomico County Department of Planning, Zoning, and Community Development to request assistance through the Community Development Block Grant program in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) to continue the County's Housing Rehabilitation Program. The project costs include \$200,000 for rehabilitation, \$30,000 for project administration, \$10,000 for Shore-Up, and \$10,000 for relocation costs of residents that may need to relocate during the process of construction. There are 230 beneficiaries on the waiting list and the number of beneficiaries that will be assisted is a minimum of 12 households.
 - B. Proposal of M.A.C., Inc., to request assistance through the Community Development Block Grant program in the amount of Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000.00) for the construction of a Wellness wing to the new Salisbury-Wicomico Senior Services Center as well as to complete areas of construction for the primary facility..
2. The County Council of Wicomico County, Maryland also agrees to contribute to aforesaid projects, thereby demonstrating its commitment to the proposals, by providing administrative and in-kind services.
3. The County Executive of Wicomico County, Maryland shall be the overall administrator and coordinator of these projects and shall delegate such duties and responsibilities to other departments as


may be necessary in the execution of these projects.




