A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE CLOSURE OF A FUTURE STREET EXTENSION LOCATED AT THE END OF PARKER ROAD, WHICH LIES BETWEEN OUTTEN ROAD AND THE SALISBURY BY-PASS AND ADJACENT TO THE NOTTINGHAM WOODS SUBDIVISION.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 15 of Chapter 197, entitled "Altering, relocating or closing streets and roads" paragraph A, a county road may not be closed unless the County Council has approved the closing, alteration or relocation of the road by resolution or by the approval of a capital project; and

WHEREAS, Salisbury Christian School, Inc. has filed a petition with the director of the Department of Public Works requesting the closing of a future street extension off of Parker Road; and

WHEREAS, Salisbury Christian School, Inc. will pay all costs associated with legal expenses, advertising the proposed closing and notifying adjoining property owners; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the future street extension closure will not adversely affect public safety, traffic network, or public convenience; and


WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works, Department of Planning and Zoning, Emergency Services, and Sheriff's Department have recommended the approval of the future street extension closure.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Wicomico County, Maryland that the future street extension located off of Parker Road is hereby closed and the County Executive is authorized to execute a Quit Claim Deed accordingly.
