Resolution No. 57-2014

Introduced by: The President of the Council at the request of the County Executive

A RESOLUTION MAKING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION FROM CONTINGENCY TO THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S OFFICE IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$2,500).

WHEREAS, Section 709 of the Wicomico County Charter authorizes and empowers the Wicomico County Council, upon the request of the County Executive, to make supplementary appropriations from the unexpended and unencumbered funds set aside for contingencies in the County budget; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 03-2013, adopted on January 15, 2013, authorized an appropriation from contingency to the County Executive's Office in the amount of Two Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) for a fiscal year 2013 financial contribution to the Maryland Rural Counties Coalition; and

WHEREAS, the County did not receive an invoice in fiscal year 2013 for payment to the Maryland Rural Counties Coalition and, therefore, the approved contribution was not sent; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive and County Council now wish to make the financial contribution that was not paid in fiscal year 2013 to the Maryland Rural Counties Coalition; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance has certified that the appropriation to be transferred is not encumbered and funds are available for transfer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Wicomico County, Maryland that the following supplementary appropriation of funds is authorized and approved:
