He said this was simply enabling the County to take advantage of grants coming from the State. He said, from what he can tell, and he does not know if Mr. Taylor has had a chance to review these or not, it does not seem as if there is any obligation on the County's part. He said there is not a concern where it might tie them into extended or exaggerated maintenance of effort. He said it is just simply enabling Legislation that allows the County to benefit from State grants should they arise. Mr. Taylor said that is correct, and it is not mandatory. Mr. Cannon said all Council really wants to do is try to get a letter forwarded to Annapolis in support of these Bills as has been requested. Mr. Cannon asked for a consensus, and there was an overall agreement. Mr. Cannon asked Mrs. Hurley to draft a letter of support for both Bills. There was no further discussion.
