


**Open Work Session
Culver Road Closing Request
December 17, 2019**

Mr. Dallas Baker, Director of Public Works, came before Council and said this is a small section of Culver Road that has been abandoned. He said, in the 1950s or 1960s, they realigned Culver Road for a better geometry of where Culver intersected Nanticoke. Mr. Dodd asked if this is the dirt road near Food Lion, to which Mr. Baker responded, no, this is the dirt road that runs in front of the church between Culver and Nanticoke. He said the only way to tell it is a road is because it still has some utility poles next to it, but it is all grassed up. He said they petitioned to get that removed, and Public Works has no problem with it because it is not part of a system they are using. Mr. McCain asked if it will revert to the church, to which Mr. Baker responded, he believes it will because the church approached the County about this. He said, the way he understands it, there are two property owners on each side, so it gets split, but he thinks the church owns both sides. Mr. Holloway said, from discussions he has had, the church wants it reverted back to them so they can sell the piece of property next door. Mr. Cannon asked if this is the road that goes from Nanticoke to Pemberton, to which Mr. Baker responded, no, this goes from Culver to Nanticoke, is kind of across the street from Williams Market at the southern part of Culver Road.

Mr. Dodd asked Mrs. Hurley where this goes from here, to which Mrs. Hurley responded, it requires a Public Hearing and three weeks of advertising, so January 21, 2020 is the earliest they can consider this. There was no further discussion.
